David Manning, in addition to his work with the Synergic Theater, has written numerous short stories and essays for literary magazines, as well as films, multi-media productions, plays and books. Along with the Synergic Theater/Suzanne, he has been a guest artist at SUNY-Brockport, SUNY-Stony Brook, Duke University, and Cedar Crest College.

Suzanne White Manning's production work with the ST and independently also includes Marymount Manhattan Theater, Cubiculo, Schimmel Center for the Arts, Herbst Theater, Project Artaud; and she has served on the faculties of the Ernie Martin Studio, Pace University, Escola de Dansa de Barcelona, UNC-G, and Duke, among other schools and arts institutions.

Peter Coster moved from London to New York about 5 years ago. He studied Drama & Movement at Hofstra University and continued his training at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts. Most recently he played Alan in the Wings Theater production of Ruby Slippers, and he spent last fall on tour with the National Theater as Romeo.

Lisa Eiesland is a graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and a former member of their production company, where she was Claire Clairemont in Brenton's Bloody Poetry and Lilina Stanislavsky in Chekhov in Yalta. She was recently seen in Connections of the Heart at the Courtyard Playhouse.

Mayumi Ohshima is from Japan and has been working with the Synergic Theater since 1989. She has designed a number of productions for Theater 22 and has studied lighting, set and costume design with Christopher Thomas, Dennis Parichy and Vanessa James. She's also doing a "sort of internship" with the Blue Man Group.

Blake Robbins is pleased to be getting his first NYC credit with the Synergic Theater. A recent graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, his favorite roles there inlude Martin Lynch-Gibbon in Severed Head and Jake in A Lie of the Mind.
